IMPORTANT NOTES – before completing the Continuation Sheet for Trust Deeds - Additional Trustees, please read the Important Notes in the Trust Deed and the following notes.

1. This Continuation Sheet must only be used in conjunction with the Trust Deed that you are creating and should be attached (bound or stapled) to it.
2. You must also add the following words to the Trust Deed '**and see also the Continuation Sheet incorporated into this Deed**' at the end of Clause 2 in Part B of the Trust Deed (relating to the appointment of additional trustees). The Settlor/Donor and all the Trustees must initial by this change to the Trust Deed.
3. The Settlor/Donor and all of the Trustees must also sign at the end of the Continuation Sheet before the Trust Deed is dated in Part A. Please note that Additional Trustee(s) onwards must also have their signature witnessed as indicated, as they are formally executing the Trust Deed.
4. Please check the Trust Deed as to the minimum number of Trustees required to exercise particular powers. Although, legally, there is no minimum or maximum number of Trustees when a trust over assets other than land is established, you should seek advice if you wish to have less than two or more than four Trustees. Please note that Legal & General may limit the number of Trustees whose names will be recorded as owners of a product to six.
5. Legal & General has drafted this Continuation Sheet to reflect the law as at 1 January 2010. Legal & General and its advisers cannot accept any responsibility for loss, damage or other claim that may arise from the use of this Continuation Sheet or the way in which you complete it.
